

### **Child Care Centre Supervisors Network Meeting Minutes**

November 4, 2014 ● 6:30 to 8:30 pm ● Power Glen Early Learning and Child Care Centre

#### 1. Welcome and Introductions

Participants introduced themselves to the group.

## 2. Acceptance of Minutes from Last Meeting

Minutes were accepted and seconded.

**Matters arising**: Ginette Wilson gave an update from Andre Laflamme, Niagara Region Public Health, confirming the information given at the previous meeting regarding kitchen cupboard doors and laundry. See below.

During the Q&A section of my presentation there were two questions that I would like to provide some feedback on.

Q. Can laundry from the kitchen be mixed with laundry from the children?

A. The answer is yes, the laundry can be mixed unless the centre is dealing with an outbreak or the linen is soiled (with fecal material).

Q. Do the centres need cupboard doors for the storage of dishes?

A. The answer is yes. Doors will reduce the likelihood of environmental contamination of the clean dishes.

#### 3. Acceptance of Agenda

The agenda was accepted with no amendments.

#### 4. Updates

- Ministry of Education Report, Jen Stewart, Child Care Licensing Service Program advisor was unable to attend and had no updates to pass onto the network
- Niagara Region Children's Services Report, Laura Rasmussen, Manager Children's Services attended and gave the following update:
  - Announcement from Ministry of Education of additional funding for salaries; however there
    are no details at the moment. Currently waiting for the template to determine how funds will
    be distributed, and hoping to be implemented January 2015.
  - Contracts and budgets will be coming out soon from the Region. They are due back on February 28, 2015 and will have commitment papers and QCCN commitment.
  - o Final Children's Plan Consultation meeting took place on October 23.
- Niagara Region Public Health Report, John Burnette Deputy Manager Environmental Health attended, on behalf of Chris Gaspar, and gave the following update:
  - Copies of the new Chapter 10 of the Health and Safety Manual will be distributed, changes refer to nutrition.
  - Health Canada updating feeding infants from 6 to 24 months of age, some information has been modified:

Sterilize the water bottles and equipment up to 4 months of age.

The type of water to make infant formula updated; purified and distilled water is not guaranteed safe, providers on well or cistern water are advised to contact Public Health if they are making formula so that their water can be tested.

Offering a variety of textures and finger foods at 6 months of age and lumpy food by 9 months of age.

#### 7. Training/Network Development Activity

- Update from the *How Does Learning Happen?* Ontario's Pedagogy for the Early Years, conference in Toronto. 350 people attended from across Ontario. A Pedagogical Documentation session was led by Dr. Carol Anne Wien and Karyn Callaghan with a Pedagogical Leadership session led by Lorrie Baird, Anne Marie Coughlin. Participants also broke into Regional groups to discuss parental engagement. This is the first of many conversations that will be taking place in Ontario with the London Region event being held on November 18. The network would like more indepth feedback at future network meetings. The Ministry of Education has produced 3 introduction booklets to *How Does Learning Happen*; one each for educators, leaders, and home child care providers. Copies are available from the ECCDC. More *Think, Feel, Act* videos will be available on the Ministry of Education website shortly.
